ROYAL BLUE RUN 2025, 20-22 June

- Day 1 20 June London (Victoria Coach Station) to Bristol via Hammersmith, Slough, Maidenhead, Reading, Newbury, Marlborough, Chippenham & Bath
- Day 2 21 June Bristol to Bournemouth (& Poole) via Bath, Frome, (East Somerset Railway), Gillingham, Shaftesbury, Blandford Forum and Poole
- Day 3 22 June Poole to Exeter (& Taunton) via Bere Regis, Dorchester, Bridport, Axminster and Honiton



Background

Our Royal Blue Runs were established in 2002 so that owners and their passengers can relive the pleasures of long distance luxury coach travel for which their carefully preserved vehicles were originally intended. The aim is to follow original Royal Blue routes as closely as possible and to travel at a leisurely pace redolent of the times. The runs also create a wonderful spectacle for innocent bystanders and dedicated photographers alike, thanks to the hard work and resources the owners have devoted to restoring and maintaining their fine coaches.

A lot of work goes into planning the runs from selecting routes from the extensive Royal Blue network and researching the original drivers' instructions and passenger timetables, preparing maps and outline routing, driving the routes to develop detailed instructions allowing for modern day features and constraints, organising refreshment stops, obtaining parking permissions, to identifying potential accommodation for a dozen or more coaches and their passengers. Despite all the preparations, final timings are hard to judge whether due to roadworks or things that might pique the interest of crews along the way. The coaches do not travel in close convoy so as not to inconvenience other road users. Drivers may also deviate from the suggested route (intentionally or unintentionally!).

For those watching the run, it is important to note that the timings are indicative and many factors may affect the out-turn on the day. In addition the coaches / drivers are free to do some or all of the run each day and some have been known to insert their own route variations, so we cannot guarantee a steady stream of all the listed coaches at the nominated time. The organisers have driven the full route several times and endeavour to keep up with the latest news on roadworks and local events.

2025 route and heritage significance

An illustrative overview of the 2025 route is given on the cover page. Further details of the principal routing and probable stopping points with indicative timings are tabulated at the end of this introduction – they may double as a useful aide memoir for drivers. Also included are the research notes relating to Royal Blue and Associated Motorways operations over the years which provide the rationale for the detailed routing.

Day 1 (Friday 20 June) The beginning of long-distance coach services can be determined in several ways, but the first to run all year round on a daily basis, picking up and setting down passengers at various towns along the route, was that initiated by Greyhound Motors, of Bristol. Using a pair of Strachan and Brown bodied Dennis coaches, this operated between London (Hammersmith) and Bristol, and began in February 1925. This year, therefore marks the centenary of the start of this service. Royal Blue also set up a service along the route in 1928, and from 1932 until 1965 these two operators jointly worked this service (after which it became just a Greyhound route). From the mid 1930s, both operators had been taken over - Greyhound by Bristol Tramways & Carriage Company, and Royal Blue by Southern / Western National (the latter also controlling the Bristol concern). Although normally Royal Blue runs have not recreated the same route as on previous occasions, the centenary of this inaugural service is considered an exception that should be marked. *Not all participating coaches will start the run at VCS, some joining at Newbury*.

Day 2 (Saturday 21 June) Early in 1927, Greyhound opened another route, from Bristol to Bournemouth, where initially their agent was Elliott Bros (Royal Blue) - until the latter started their own service between those places! There were two alternative routes - either via Shaftesbury or via Salisbury, and the Royal Blue run 2025 will follow the former.

Day 3 (Sunday 22 June) The take-over of Royal Blue by Southern / Western National took place in 1935, so this year marks the 90th anniversary of that event, when the company head office was moved from Bournemouth to Exeter (although many administrative and engineering functions remained in Bournemouth), so the third day of the 2025 run will link them. Several coaches will follow a former Royal Blue route from Exeter to Taunton as they head north and east at the end of the three-day coach run.
